hypertension control project. We are showing significant improvement in hypertension control targets and working on other projects. We appreciate the help from PTN and HHN team to keep us on track.

We are excited about our participation in the CCPN and all of the possibilities it may offer. Our practice is most interested in group purchasing for vaccines and chronic care management.

The ability to join with other practices in our community to strengthen our voice is encouraging. We hope this collaboration will prepare us for the future and help us to navigate health care reform successfully.

Pursuing PCMH in 2017: Upcoming Standards Changes and Process Redesign

This September 27 webinar will highlight changes on the horizon for practices participating in NCQA's PCMH recognition program. [\(Registration links on page 1\)](#)

- For currently recognized practices there are several options for renewal depending on the standards they are recognized under and the level of recognition.
- For practices seeking recognition for the first time there is a new process that helps them pre-assess, transform, achieve recognition and then sustain their Patient-Centered Medical Home.
- The proposed PCMH 2017 requirements address an evolving focus on patient needs beyond the medical care of the past decades and prepares practices for new demands in the healthcare environment.
- Changing regulatory requirements continue to push practices towards value and quality of care over volume of services delivered.
- NCQA will provide an overview of the new requirements under (MACRA), including information on how NCQA recognized practices can automatically receive credit for the clinical practice improvement category.

A total of 1,070 clinicians in 310 practices are a part of the Community Care Physician Network as of 8/31/2016. For a list of practices see below and on the following pages. Note, practices with multiple office locations are listed just once.
